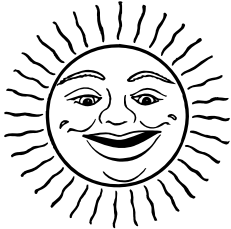

Don't despair - our next meeting in August will address some of these issues with the help of a massage therapist. I recently had an experience myself with a therapist helping me “unlock” my pelvic region and guess what – better half-passes and flying changes. Our horses are our mirrors after all, whatever does not work in your body will most likely not work in your horse's body either. More details to follow on meeting time and place.

Entries: Use the 2007 RMDS entry form – send separate entries for schooling shows and RMDS shows with separate checks. Make checks payable to CSDA and send entries together with check to Secretary. All entries refunded except office fee if withdrawn before closing date. After closing date, only with a VET excuse AND if ride is filled! If snow, refund policy will be reconsidered. Show arenas will be 20X60 – Intro and Training levels may be held in 20X40. Times are tentative and will be available 4-5 days prior to show. Will send times is SASE enclosed, otherwise times will be available at www.csdressage.org or by phoning secretary.

Refunds: Up to closing date, all fees refunded except office fee. From day after closing to day prior to competition, class fees will be refunded only if ride(s) can be filled from wait list. Qualifying fees and drug fee (if horse is not on show grounds) refunded. During competition days **no refunds including Acts of God. Office fee is nonrefundable.**

Awards: Ribbons to 6th place all divisions. Ties broken if collective marks differ, otherwise left tied.

Directions to Aspen Ridge: I-25 to Exit 161, Monument. East on Hwy 105, 4.5mi to Roller Coaster Road. Right on Roller Coaster Rd, 1.6mi to Higby Rd, turn right, first left is Aspen Ridge Farm. **NO DOGS PLEASE!!**
